Mental Health Awareness Month

Whether you are dealing with depression, anxiety, or post-traumatic stress, reaching out for support can make a significant difference to your overall health. Mental health conditions are **treatable** — read on for more information about the resources available to you and your covered dependents.

Remember, if you or someone you care for is experiencing a medical or mental health emergency, call 911 immediately or go to the nearest hospital.

Medical Plan Coverage

All Edison medical plans provide coverage for mental health and substance use treatment. Coverage includes outpatient treatment sessions (in-person, telephonic, or virtual), inpatient treatment, partial hospitalization, and intensive outpatient treatment. National Women's Health Week starts each year on Mother's Day. This health observance encourages women and girls to prioritize their physical, mental, social and emotional health by making (and keeping!) health care appointments and practicing health behaviors year-round.

Make an Appointment for a Well-Woman Visit

If you haven't already scheduled your annual visit, Women's Health Week is your reminder to make an appointment. All Edison health plans include annual well-woman care visits at no cost when delivered by a provider in your plan's network.

Well-woman visits focus on preventive care, which may include:

- A physical exam
- Services, like vaccines, that improve your health by preventing diseases and other health problems
- Screening tests to check for diseases early when they may be easier to treat
- Education and counseling to help you make informed health decisions

Telemedicine — Your 24/7 Virtual Healthcare Solution

Telemedicine offers a convenient and efficient alternative to traditional in-person visits. By leveraging technology, telemedicine allows you to connect with healthcare providers from the comfort of your own home, making it easier than ever to receive quality care.

Some of the key benefits of virtual visits:

- **Convenient:** Access healthcare services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, at times that work best for you.
- **Accessible:** Reach healthcare providers regardless of your location, making it easier for those in remote or underserved areas to receive care.
- **Safe:** Avoid traveling in bad weather and exposure to crowded waiting rooms.

Virtual care is a great option for everyday, non-emergency healthcare issues, such as allergies, cold and flu symptoms, skin conditions, infections, or minor injuries. Providers can diagnose, recommend treatment, and prescribe medication (when appropriate), for many medical issues.

If you are enrolled in an Edison medical plan, you and your covered dependents can conveniently take advantage of your plan's telemedicine solution. Services can typically be accessed by app, web, or phone, and visits are available by phone or video. Telemedicine visits are also typically available without a copay.

Aetna Members

If you are enrolled in an Aetna medical plan, you can access CVS Health Virtual Care™ in addition to your traditional network of providers. To get started, visit CVS.com/virtual-care and enter the plan information from your insurance card. Enter your condition or symptom to find out what care options are available, then book a virtual visit that works with your schedule.

Kaiser Members

If you are enrolled in Kaiser, you can access 24/7 virtual care by signing into your KP.org account with your user ID and password. Under **Appointments & Care**, select "Get started at Get Care" to see your visit options. You can choose from a video or phone visit.



Shine a Light on Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)

Traumatic events such as wildfires, natural disasters, or accidents, can have lasting effects on a person's mental health. While many will have short-term responses to life-threatening events, some will develop longer term symptoms that can lead to a diagnosis of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

Common PTSD symptoms

- | Nightmares or flashbacks
- | Avoiding reminders of the trauma
- | Memory problems
- | Negative thoughts
- | Depression, isolation, sadness
- | Difficulty relating to or interacting with others
- | Feeling irritable or angry
- | Being constantly alert, on guard, or jumpy
- | Difficulty sleeping
- | Difficulty concentrating

Other symptoms of PTSD may include:

- | **Physical symptoms:** Experiencing chronic pain, headaches, stomach pain, diarrhea, tightness or burning in the chest, muscle cramps or low back pain.
- | **Substance use:** Using drugs or alcohol to cope with the emotional pain.
- | **Relationship problems:** Having problems with intimacy or feeling detached from your family and friends.

In children, PTSD symptoms may look different than in adults. Children may have:

- | Sleep disturbances including fear of sleep, nightmares or bedwetting
- | Loss of interest in things they used to enjoy
- | Bad tempered, aggressive or even violent behavior
- | Re-creating and re-living the traumatic event through talk or play
- | Behaviors that they should have grown out of (for example, sucking their thumb, or wanting to sleep with a parent or sibling)

Recovery and Coping Strategies

Recovering from PTSD requires a multifaceted approach. Here are some strategies that can help individuals cope and recover:

- Seek Professional Help:** Therapy, such as cognitive-behavioral therapy (CBT), can be highly effective in treating PTSD. Medications may also be prescribed to manage symptoms.
- Build a Support Network:** Connecting with family, friends, and support groups can provide emotional support and reduce feelings of isolation.
- Practice Self-Care:** Engaging in regular physical activity, maintaining a healthy diet, and getting adequate sleep are crucial for overall well-being.
- Mindfulness and Relaxation Techniques:** Practices such as meditation, deep breathing exercises, and yoga can help manage stress and anxiety.

Edison provides a variety of resources to help you and your family cope with PTSD. You can seek help through the Optum Employee Assistance Plan (EAP) at liveandworkwell.com (access code: **edison**). In addition, you can go to www.edisonretireebenefits.com and refer to the Health Plans Comparison or the Mental Wellness and Substance Use Benefit Overview for your plan. For more specific coverage details, contact your health plan provider. To find contact information for your plan, refer to your medical plan ID card.

- A quick, easy and confidential way to determine if you may be experiencing PTSD is to take a screening. A screening is not a diagnosis, but a way of understanding if your symptoms are having enough of an impact that you should seek help from a doctor or other professional.
