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Optum EAP

- An Optum EAP emotional support line is available for those affected by the California wildfires in Los Angeles and Ventura counties. The toll-free line is open to the public for two calendar weeks starting on Jan. 8.
- The service is free of charge and open to anyone. Specially trained Optum mental health specialists help people manage their stress and anxiety so they can continue to address their everyday needs. Callers may also receive referrals to community resources to help them with specific concerns, including financial and legal matters.

Express Scripts Prescription Drug Coverage

- Due to the evacuations in California, Express Scripts is closely monitoring impacts on upcoming shipments, specifically ice and ambient medications. Express Scripts Home Delivery and Accredo pharmacies will make calls to impacted patients, as appropriate.
- Emergency Access to Benefits/Refill Too Soon prescription refill requirements have been lifted in Los Angeles and Ventura counties through Feb. 6 to ensure members continue to have access to prescription medications as needed.
